ANTHONY CROCITTO • FIFTH SEASON • HOFSTRA '95



Anthony Crocitto was named head women's basketball coach at NYIT in 2009 and enters his fifth season at the helm of the Bears program.

In the program's 30th season, Crocitto directed the Bears to several program milestones including the best overall record (23-6), the program's first national ranking (as high as No. 17), and the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament. The team opened the year with an undefeated 15-0 through mid-January and finished second in the East Coast Conference with a 14-4 mark. For their efforts, seniors Nikko Jo Rotolo and Rebecca Lynch earned All-ECC honors as well as All-Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association honors. Freshman Dina Ragab was named to the ECC All-Rookie team. The Bears also saw a six-year record shatter as Demitra Apergis became the school's all-time assists leader.

In 2011-2012, Crocitto and the Bears continued to double their wins tally with a 16-13 record, which was the program's first over .500 season. NYIT finished 9-7 in East Coast Conference play, and earning the Bears third ECC playoff berth. However, they fell 85-70 to neighboring LIU Post in the quarterfinals. Three Bears were named All-ECC - Cierra Baker, Rebecca Lynch and Nikki Jo Rotolo and Crocitto earned his first coaching honor when he was named the All-Met Division II Women's Coach of the Year.

In 2010-2011, NYIT rebounded with an 8-18 overall record and a 6-15 ECC mark. Junior transfer Cierra Baker, who played for Crocitto at Longwood University, averaged a season double-double with 17.5 points per game and 12.4 rebounds per game and earned All-ECC first team and All-Met honors. Freshman Demitra Apergis finished eighth in the ECC in assists after leading NYIT with 70 and earned All-Rookie team honors. Crocitto's first season with the Bears was a true transition year as they compiled a meager 4-23 overall record and a 4-15 mark in the ECC.

Prior to joining the Bears in 2009, Crocitto spent two seasons as the top assistant for the women's basketball program at Longwood University. Prior to his time at Longwood, Crocitto served as the assistant head coach at the University of Central Florida in Orlando (2006-2007) after a two-year stint (2004-2006) as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Hofstra University in Hempstead, N.Y.

As a first assistant coach at Fairleigh Dickinson University, Crocitto helped the program achieve a fourth-place national academic ranking when FDU posted an NCAA Division I Top 10 turnaround season (2003-2004).

Crocitto has also held head coaching positions at Mount Ida and Dowling. During his tenure at Dowling, he helped the school to at least 15 wins during three of four seasons after the program had won just 10 games combined during the previous four years. He has served as the recruiting coordinator at each of his previous collegiate coaching stops since 1997.

Crocitto coordinated a recruiting class at UCF that included three national rankings in the nation's top 50, while also assisting with academic monitoring that led to a team GPA above 3.0 each semester. He helped accomplish the same team academic successes at Hofstra, which finished 19-12 during 2005-2006 en route to earning the school's first post-season win in the WNIT.

Crocitto was also head basketball coach at Holy Child High School in Westbury, N.Y. (1994-1996), and director and head coach for both St. Martin of Tours Basketball program in Amityville, N.Y. (1989-96) and Amityville Warriors AAU Basketball (1993-1996). He was head baseball coach at Walt Whitman High School in Huntington, N.Y. (1994-1996), La Salle Center in Oakdale, N.Y. (1997-1998), and at Bayport/Blue Point High School in Blue Point, N.Y. (1998-2000). Crocitto has worked at numerous summer camps as both a coach and administrator/director.

A native of Amityville, N.Y., he earned a Bachelor of Arts in management with a minor in psychology from Hofstra in 1995. He and wife Kristin, an elementary education teacher, reside in Huntington Station with their daughter, Skai Grace.

WAYNE JONES

Assistant Coach
Fourth season at NYIT

Wayne Jones joined NYIT's women's basketball coaching staff in the fall of 2010. As a player development specialist, Jones handles player shooting, footwork, and team defense.

Jones has been involved with basketball for more than 20 years and his coaching has produced top players at the Division I, II, and III levels. His top players, including Luka Hocevar, have gone on to play professionally in Europe, and most recently, Ryan Kannegieter signed with the American Basketball Association's Colorado Cougars.

Jones' tie to the Bears program come from having co-directed St. Martin's of Amityville's C.Y.O. program with NYIT head coach Anthony Crocitto and training 2010-2011 East Coast Conference All-Rookie combo guard Demitra Apergis.

Jones started his high school coaching career in 1995 at Colorado Academy in Denver, Colo. He remained there through the 1999 season. As the head men's varsity coach at Colorado Academy, Jones' teams regularly competed for the league championship.

Jones continued his career of developing players with 15 years of camp coaching at the prestigious Hoop Group Camps (formerly Eastern Invitational). At the Hoop Group, Jones worked with Dave Hopla, a world-renowned shooting instructor; Bob Hurley Sr., a Basketball Hall of Fame member; Kevin Boyle, the 2011 High School National Coach of the Year; and Mike Rice of Rutgers University.

Jones studied Sports Industry Operations at Metropolitan State College of Denver, Colo. He is a native of Massapequa, N.Y., and resides in the Pennsylvania Poconos with his wife Traci, son Keshawn, and daughter Kiaya.



TESIA HARRIS

Assistant Coach
First season at NYIT

Tesia Harris was named an assistant coach for the NYIT women's basketball program in September 2013. She is responsible for assisting specifically with the guards and team offense. Prior to NYIT, Harris volun-

teered as an assistant coach at Half Hollow Hills West High school in Dix Hills, N.Y.

Harris reached 1,016 career points during her collegiate career with three seasons at Delaware and one year at St. John's (N.Y.) She assisted St. John's to an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2012 against the No. 2 seed then-sixth-ranked Duke. St. John's finished the 2011-2012 season ranked No. 15 in ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and No.14 in Associated Press Coaches Poll. In 2012-2013, Harris continued her career overseas playing professionally in one of the top divisions in Slovakia with SBK Samorin.

At Delaware, Harris earned 2009 Colonial Athletic Association Preseason second team honors, the Team MVP award, and the Blue Hen Basketball Club Outstanding achievement award. She led Delaware with 13.6 points per game and made 51 three-pointers as a sophomore in the 2008-2009 season.

Harris graduated from St. Johns (N.Y.) with a bachelor's degree in English with a minor in sociology. She has five siblings who are also active in basketball: Torrel Jr.; Tobias, who was drafted No. 19 in the 2011 NBA Draft currently playing his third year with the Orlando Magic; Tyler, a redshirt sophomore at Providence; Terry, a senior at Half Hollow Hills West and the varsity basketball team's leading scorer; and Tori, who also plays varsity girls basketball for Half Hollow Hills West.



LISA CLAXTON

Assistant Coach
Third season at NYIT

Lisa Claxton joined the NYIT women's basketball program in September 2011. No stranger to the East Coast Conference, Claxton played one season at Molloy and helped the Lions to the 2009-2010 ECC Championship.

Claxton graduated from St. John's University with a bachelor's degree in sports management before transferring to Molloy for graduate school. While with the Red Storm, Claxton helped the team to its first NCAA Appearance since 1988.

Claxton graduated from Cardinal O'Hara High School as one of the top point guards in Philadelphia. She helped her team to a No. 14 national ranking and the top spot in the state of Pennsylvania. A two-time Street and Smith's honorable mention, Claxton averaged 10 points, six assists, and 3.8 steals per game. For her efforts, she was earned All-Catholic League and All-City honors.

Claxton is one of seven children, four of whom played basketball. Most notable is her brother Craig "Speedy" Claxton, a retired NBA player and currently a scout for the Golden State Warriors. Additionally, brother Michael played at Villanova and sister Stacey Ann played for Hofstra.

This is accomplished through mentoring children in schools, participating in sports clinics, reading at neighborhood elementary schools, visiting with senior citizens, and cooking at the Ronald McDonald House. These are just a few examples of the projects in which NYIT student-athletes have participated.

At NYIT, community service and outreach programs are paramount to the development of the student-athlete experience. NYIT student-athletes spend more than 2,000 hours in community service projects each academic year.

Clyde M. Doughty Jr.

31 Years

Clyde Doughty, Jr., has been at NYIT for 37 years, since the day he first attended a class at the Old Westbury campus (1976). A native of Hollis, Queens, New York, Doughty attended Brooklyn Technical High School, where he played three seasons of varsity basketball.

He earned a scholarship to NYIT and during his basketball career, the Bears made it to the NCAA Tournament twice, losing in the championship game to Virginia Union in 1979-80. After graduating, Doughty became the academic advisor to student-athletes, and three years later, he became the Assistant Director of Athletics. In 1988, he succeeded Dr. William T. Lai as Director of Athletics.

Doughty currently oversees intercollegiate, recreational and intramural athletic programs at the Old Westbury and Manhattan campuses. He counts among his achievements enhancing the athletics department's organizational structure and stability, and improving the academic performances of NYIT's student-athletes. During Doughty's tenure, the Bears have made numerous appearances in NCAA and ECAC post-season play. The men's lacrosse team has won the NCAA National championship four times, 1997, 2003, 2005 and 2008, the ECAC Championship in 2001 and appeared in the NCAA championship game on two other occasions, 1994 and 2002. The men's basketball team captured the ECAC championship in 1995, while the men's track and field

placed third at the NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 1999 and second at the indoor championships in 2001.

Doughty, who earned a bachelor's degree in business management, has two master's degrees from NYIT: one in human resource management and one in human relations.

Doughty has served as chair of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference's men's basketball committee, the men's basketball chair of the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference, and was a member of the NCAA's Northeast Men's Basketball Regional Committee for three years. He was president of the NYCAC from 1994 through 1997, and was a member of the ECAC's Executive Council from 1989 until 1992.

In January 2001, Doughty was named to a four-year term as a member of the NCAA Division II Management Council. The council implements policies adopted by the NCAA Executive Committee and the Presidents' Council, interprets Division II bylaws, and recommends the adoption of amendments and regulations regarding Division II athletics. In 2013, he was appointed to a second term as a member of the Division II Management Council.

As part of his Management Council responsibilities, Doughty has served on two project teams and has been a member of the committees on budget and finance, championships, the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), the honors committee, and nominations committee.

In 2004, Doughty was selected by the National Athletic Directors Association (NACDA) as the Division II Northeast Region Athletic Director of the Year.

Doughty currently serves on the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Group within the student affairs division. The group supports NCAA staff in the areas of education programs, health and safety and leadership development. Since 2009, Doughty has also served as the master of ceremonies for the NCAA Career in Sports Forum.

During his tenure, Doughty has assisted in the development and implementation of the Bears Den fundraising club, the establishment of the Athletic Hall of Fame, the annual Bears Golf Outing, the Athletic Directors Honor roll, the BEARS mentor educational program, the Senior Awards banquet, the Bears Care Community Service program, and the Night Out on The Bears community engagement program.

"I am honored that I have been able to sustain a very fruitful career at NYIT," he says. "I have been blessed to work with great individuals who have taken the time to help me mature as an administrator, mentor, parent, and human being."

Doughty resides in Wheatley Heights, NY, with his wife, Pamela, his mother, Ida, and three children: 33-year-old Brandon, 25-year-old Jessica, and 21-year-old Andre.

DIRECTIONS TO NYIT

BY CAR

FROM THE WEST:

Long Island Expressway (I-495) to exit 39N (Glen Cove Road). Follow Glen Cove Road north to Northern Blvd. (Route 25 A). Turn right onto Northern Blvd. and head east. The NYIT entrance is the third traffic signal on your right.

FROM THE EAST:

LIE (I-495) to exit 41N (Route 107). Go north (toward Glen Cove) on Rte. 107 to Northern Blvd. (Route 25A). Turn left onto Northern Blvd. and continue west for four traffic lights. Make a left into NYIT's main entrance at the fourth traffic light.

FROM THE SOUTH SHORE:

Take either the Meadowbrook, Cross Island or Wantagh Parkways north to the Northern State Parkway, exit 31. Make a left at light, proceed north on Glen Cove Road until you reach Northern Blvd. and follow the above directions.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:

The Long Island Rail Road provides access at several stations: Hicksville, Manhasset and Greenvale (closest to campus). The Metropolitan Transit Authority's Route N20 bus, which travels from Main Street in Flushing to the Hicksville train station via Northern Blvd. stops adjacent to the main entrance of the campus.
