On July 9, New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) named Bob Malvagna head coach of its NCAA Division I baseball program. Malvagna, the fifth head coach in the history of NYIT baseball, replaces Michael MacMillan, who served as interim head coach last season after the retirement long-time coach Bob Hirschfield. Hirschfield retired in October 2011 after 33 years at the helm.

"I am extremely excited to lead the NYIT baseball program," said Malvagna. "With the support of our alumni and the NYIT community, I hope to build on the program's successes and winning traditions."

Malvagna's 20 years of experience coaching Long Island collegiate and club teams includes serving as associate head coach at Adelphi University under the direction of Hall of Fame Coach Ron Davis (2001-2003) and Dom Scala (2004-2010). As the hitting and third-base coach, he helped the Panthers to two NCAA Division II Regional bids and five winning seasons. Under his tutelage, 13 student-athletes earned All-East Region honors from Daktronics, American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA), Rawlings, and the National College Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA).

In 2011, Malvagna left Adelphi to assist Nassau Community College to the NCAA Division III Region XV Tournament. Most recently, he served as an assistant coach under Roger Mischel at Queensborough Community College, where he helped guide the team to the 2012 CUNY Championship.

"We are pleased to be bringing Bob Malvagna aboard to usher in a new era in Bears baseball," said NYIT Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation Clyde M. Doughty Jr. "His years of experience, as well as his knowledge of the game and recruiting, are a great fit for our baseball program. I eagerly await next season."

A member of the St. John's University baseball team from 1975 to 1979, Malvagna played in the 1978 College World Series. Former teammates include Major Leaguers John Franco and Frank Viola. Malvagna graduated from St. John's in 1979 with a bachelor of science in communication arts.

He currently resides in East Meadow, N.Y., with his wife, Mary, and three sons, Stephen, Ryan, and RJ.

**CHRIS ROJAS**  
Pitching Coach  
Second Season

Chris Rojas, a Brooklyn native who was a student-athlete at NYIT from 1994 to 1998, joined the Bears coaching staff in September 2011. He is responsible for the instruction of the pitching staff.

Rojas walked on to the baseball program in 1994 and developed into an everyday player by his junior year when he earned a job as a starting centerfielder and starting pitcher. Rojas went on to be named Mid-Continent All-Conference in both his junior and senior seasons.

In 1998, Rojas was signed as a free agent by the Pittsburgh Pirates organization and was converted into a full-time pitcher. Rojas played 10 seasons with three organizations (Pirates, Padres, and Phillies). In his first full season with the Pirates, Rojas played in the N.Y. Penn League. He was fifth in the league in strikeouts and led the team in innings pitched and wins. In 2000, Rojas was signed by the San Diego Padres and joined the organization's Low A team. During the 2000 campaign, Rojas established the lowest earned run average of any starter with 15 or more starts in the Mid-West League, posting an 2.72 ERA. The following year, Rojas had one of his most impressive seasons playing for the Lake Elsinore Storm of the Cal League, where he was named to the All-Star team along with teammates Jake Peavy and Xavier Nady. Rojas finished the season fourth in the league in ERA, third in strikeouts, and led the entire Padre organization in innings pitched and wins. In 2002, Rojas was a part of a rotation that was named by *Baseball America* as the best starting rotation in Minor League history. During his time with the Padre organization (2000-2004), Rojas reached the AAA level while participating in two All-Star games (2001 Cal League Hi A and 2004 Southern League AA).

In 2005, Rojas signed with the Philadelphia Phillies as a Minor League free agent and led the AA Eastern League in wins while splitting time between AA and AAA. Rojas was once again named to an All-Star team and was awarded Pitcher of the Year by the Phillies organization.

The 2006 season proved to be Rojas' most memorable season as a professional as he was selected as a participant in the inaugural event of the World Baseball Classic, representing Team Puerto Rico along with many great players such as Carlos Beltran, Carlos Delgado, Ivan Rodriguez, Bernie Williams, Yadier Molina, Javy Lopez, and Javier Vasquez.

Since retiring, Rojas managed the Long Island Collegians of the Atlantic College Baseball League (ABCL) during the summers of 2010 and 2011, and was the head coach of the St. Dominic High School junior varsity team.

Some of Rojas' other notable achievements include playing eight seasons in the Puerto Rico Winter League for the Mayaguez Indios. While playing for the Indios, Rojas played in two Caribbean World Series. He also represented the Puerto Rico National Team in the Pre-Olympics in Panama and the Pan-Am Games in Holland.

Rojas and his wife, Paola, reside in Queens, N.Y., and are the parents of two boys, C.J. and Justin.



**STEVE MALVAGNA**  
Assistant Coach  
First Season

Stephen Malvagna joined the Bears coaching staff in June 2012. His primary responsibilities are to work with the catchers and serve as bench coach.

Malvagna comes to the Bears after spending five years in professional baseball. In 2006, Malvagna signed a free agent contract with the New York Mets and spent two-and-a-half years in the Mets organization. In 2007 he helped the Brooklyn Cyclones to a McNamara Division Championship. He then went on to play for the Kalamazoo Kings of the Frontier League in 2009 and 2010. In 2011, Malvagna signed a professional contract with the Parma Baseball Club of the Italian Baseball League.

Malvagna graduated from Adelphi University in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice.

Anthony Bonomo Jr. joined the Bears coaching staff in June 2012. His primary responsibilities are to work with the infielders.

A four-year starter for St. Mary's High School, Bonomo earned a full athletic scholarship to Adelphi University where he played for NYIT head coach Bob Malvagna. After graduation, Bonomo returned to St. Mary's and coached its baseball program for two years.

Bonomo graduated from Adelphi in 2009 with a bachelor's in sociology. He currently resides in Manhasset, N.Y.


While at St. Mary's, Rubino and his staff were honored once with the CHSAA Coach of the Year Award and the Sportsmanship Coaches Award three times. During his tenure at St. Mary's, Rubino mentored 13 student athletes in achieving a NCAA Division I Baseball Scholarship.

Rubino played second base and was an outfielder from 1990-1993 at LIU Post under the mentoring of ACBA Hall of Fame Coach Dick Vining. Rubino was also a member of the 1991 ECAC Championship team.

A native of Little Neck, N.Y., Rubino attended Benjamin N. Cardozo High School in Queens, N.Y., where he lettered three years in baseball. Rubino played second base and was a key member of winning the 1998 PSAL Championship at Yankee Stadium. 





**MARCH 20, 1981**

NYIT 1, Michigan 0 • In the Bears fourth game at the Division I level, Al Labozetta tosses a complete game victory, allowing only three hits and striking out five. Bob Costelo drives in NYIT's only run with a sac fly. Michigan was ranked 10th in the nation.

**APRIL 13, 1982**

NYIT 10, Temple 7 • Down 5-1 after the first inning, the Bears rally for the 10-7 win. Jim Scudero and Hank Iervolino combine for 13 K's as Joe LaCugna (four RBI) and Jim Dalton (three RBI) key the comeback.

**APRIL 24, 1982**

NYIT 13, Fordham 6, NYIT 8, Fordham 2

**APRIL 25, 1982**

NYIT 10, LaSalle 13 • The Bears played four games on the road during the weekend, sweeping both double-headers. Mike Salvemini (3 HR), Brian Brady (three triples and a HR) and Don Moscatelli (triple, HR, eight RBI) lead the Bears over their ECAC rivals.

**APRIL 4, 1983**

NYIT 18, James Madison 6 • Larry Minor hits two home runs to lead the Bears from a 5-1 deficit to the 18-6 rout. Fred Giovanelli slams the door on JMU in the sixth, going on to record the win. James Madison went on to the College World Series that year.

**APRIL 13-MAY 6, 1983**

NYIT wins 14 out of 16 games, going from 7-4 to 21-6.

**MAY 13,14,15, 1983**

ECAC Playoffs at St. John's • Larry Minor hits the "legendary" home run against Buffalo in the opener and Al Silverstein gets a 2-1 complete game victory against host St. John's in finale to give NYIT its first NCAA bid in their third year in Division I.

**APRIL 18, 1984**

NYIT 5, Rice 3 • The Bears continue to gain national respect with a dramatic, extra-inning victory over then-No. 6 Rice. The Owls score three times in the ninth to force the extra frames, but in the eleventh, Brian Brady drives home the go-ahead run and Mike Umamo gives the Bears the two-run edge. George Banos records three K's in the bottom of the inning for the victory.

**APRIL 21, 1984**

NYIT 9, Lamar 3 • In Beaumont, Texas, the Bears defeat the then-No. 25 Cardinals with three RBI from Jim Dalton and two RBI from Fred Giovanelli. Al Labozetta goes the distance for the victory.

**MARCH 16, 1985**

NYIT 26, Towson 3 • The Bears knock out six doubles, five triples, and a home run to post what remains to be their biggest season opener. NYIT goes on to a 31-15 season.

**APRIL 6, 1985**

NYIT 12, Hartford 7; NYIT 7, Hartford-4 • The Bears collect 23 hits, including four home runs (two from Mike Frustaci) to sweep the double header from ECAC rival Hartford.

**APRIL 11, 1985**

NYIT 12, New Orleans 9 • George Banos goes five innings and records the win over then-No. 10 UNO as the Bears, up 11-3 after three innings, hang on for the 12-9 victory. Al Silverstein tosses the last three innings for the save.

**APRIL 14, 1985**

NYIT 12, S.W.Louisiana 1 • NYIT scores seven in the first inning as Fred Giovanelli and Al Silverstein combine to hold the then-No. 24 team in the country to one run and six hits.

**APRIL 14-28, 1985**

NYIT wins 13 games straight, including three each from ECAC Metro conference rivals St. Francis, FDU-Teaneck and Brooklyn College. The Bears out-scored their opponents 143-37 and never allow more than five runs in a game.

**MAY 5, 1985**

NYIT 9, Maryland-5; NYIT 6, Maryland 3 • The Bears pull off their come-from-behind trick twice in one day at Maryland. In the first game, down 4-0, the Bears get home runs from Mike Frustaci (2), Keith Locklear and Ray Giannelli. In the second game, All-American Fred Leone hits a three run blast in the sixth, giving the Bears the 6-3 margin. Joe Grecopitche, in relief, earned wins in both games, while Mike Conklin earned the save in both games. The second game was head coach Bob Hirschfield's 100th coaching victory.

**MAY 9, 1985**

NYIT 28, Lafayette 5 • Ray Giannelli goes 7-for-8 with 10 RBIs in Easton, Pa. The 28 runs is the most ever scored by a Bears team in one game.

**MAY 17, 1986**

NYIT 9, Northeastern 1 • New York Tech's third game of the 1986 ECAC Playoffs was Mike Conklin's finest performance of the season. He goes the full nine innings, records 12 K's, gives up one run on seven hits, and puts down the last 12 batters faced. The Bears go on to the championship round vs. 1985 College World Series entrant Maine.

**March 8-14, 1987**

NYIT posts a 6-2-1 record in the Hall of Fame Tournament at Georgia Southern University to win the championship. The Bears earn wins over Georgia Southern, James Madison and West Virginia.

**APRIL 2, 1987**

NYIT 18, Hartford 0; NYIT 4, Hartford 3 • Tom Boyce leads the Bears offense in a double-header sweep. In the first game, he hits two home runs for five RBI. Alex Protosow, Ray Karczewski and Mike Chesney also hit two home runs. In the second game, Boyce hits a 3-2 pitch with two out in the last inning for a solo home run and the victory.

**MAY 16, 1987**

ECAC Playoffs at Bristol, Conn. NYIT 10, C.W. Post 5 • Art Canestro throws a complete game for the victory that puts the Bears into the championship round. He gets 10 strikeouts while scattering eight hits.

**MARCH 9, 1988**

NYIT 4, Central Michigan 2 • Mark Hannon goes the distance, allowing only two runs on four hits in the second game of the Jody Ramsey Tournament in McAllen, Texas. Central Michigan is ranked #21 in the nation and goes on to be a finalist in the NCAA Midwest Regional that year.

**APRIL 24, 1988**

NYIT 26, Pace 6 • The Bear's pound out 11 home runs in one game, tying the NCAA record for most home runs in a game. In the fourth inning they get six homeruns, setting an NCAA record for most home runs in an inning.

**MARCH 26, 1989**

NYIT 5, Maine 3 • In the middle game of an Easter Sunday triple header, John Comer provides the difference with a two run home run in the eighth inning. Maine is ranked #29 in the nation.

**APRIL 1, 1989**

NYIT 11, Old Dominion 9 • The Bears, down 9-3 after six innings, stage a six-run seventh started by a mammoth home run from John Comer and capped off with a two RBI double from Al Watson, tying the score. NYIT scores two in the eighth for the victory.

**APRIL 21, 1989**

NYIT 5, Brooklyn College 0 • Jim O'Connor records the first no-hit, no-run game in NYIT history, getting two strikeouts and walking three.

**MAY 6, 1989**

NYIT 10, West Chester 0 • Two weeks after his no-hitter, Jim O'Connor goes through the first 26 batters without a scratch, but the 27th gets a single to center field, breaking up O'Connor's bid for a second no-hitter. He records two strikeouts's without a walk.

**APRIL 8, 1990**

NYIT 8, West Chester 0 • Al Watson does to West Chester what O'Connor did one year earlier. In the second game of a doubleheader, Watson gives up only one hit, and retires the last twelve batters he faces for a one-hit shut-out. He strikes out four, walks one.

**APRIL 19, 1990**

NYIT 11, LeMoyne 7; NYIT 3, LeMoyne 2 • The Bears travel to Syracuse for a mid-week doubleheader against the 1990 ECAC Championship/NCAA Northeast Regional Finalists. In the first game All-American Paul Bruno hits two homeruns and Mike Fernandez hits a two-run homer, which gave the bears a 7-6 lead, to support the come-from-behind victory. John Manfredo gets the win in relief. In the second game, Bruno and Alex Protosow hit solo homeruns for the Bears, but again it was Mike Fernandez with the RBI single that gave NYIT the 3-2 win. Al Watson gets the win, and Manfredo the save.

**MAY 6, 1990**

NYIT 10, C.W. Post 0 • Jim O'Connor turns in another outstanding performance in a Diamond Conference Game, recording his second career one-hit shutout. He puts down the first 17 batters faced, strikes out four, and posts no walks.

**MAY 12, 1990**

NYIT 11, Pace 2; NYIT 6, Pace 5 • The Bears sweep doubleheader from Diamond Conference rivals Pace. In the first game, Al Watson tosses a complete game victory and records 10 K's, giving him 84 on the season for a new school record. In the second, All-American Paul Bruno hits his school record 20th home run of the season as the Bears finish their 1990 Conference schedule 11-0 and become the first Diamond Conference Champions to go undefeated. The series sweep extends the Bears winning streak to 14 games.

**MAY 18, 1990**

NYIT 7, LeMoyne 0 • Al Watson tosses a complete game, four-hit shut out in the ECAC Playoffs. Watson records eight K's and earns a spot on the Playoff All-Star team for his performance.

**MARCH 3, 1991**

Georgia Southern 2, NYIT 1 • "The best pitching performance I've ever seen in New York Tech baseball," said Coach Bob Hirschfield. All-American Al Watson records 14 strikeouts with only three hits, but the Bears lose the game on a throwing error.

**MARCH 23, 1991**

NYIT 13, Univ. of Maryland Eastern Shore 0; NYIT 14 UMES 0 • In the first game, John Weglarz breaks the single game strikeout record that Watson set three weeks earlier, recording 15K's. Weglarz earns his first win of the season, and

does not lose again in 1991. In the second game, Mike Korabik, in a spot start, throws a rain shortened, five inning one-hitter. The first game was Head Coach Bob Hirschfield's 250th coaching victory.

**APRIL 16, 1991**

NYIT 8, FDU-Teaneck 2 • Mike Fernandez hits the first cycle in NYIT history, accounting for seven of the Bear's eight runs.

**MAY 10, 1991**

NYIT 7, FDU-Teaneck 2 • All-American Al Watson completes his record breaking season on the mound, pitching his sixth complete game, recording his ninth win, and adding 13 K's to his season total of 99. All three are new school records.

**MAY 1, 1991**

NYIT 5, Fordham 0; NYIT 6, Fordham 3 • The Bears sweep arch rival Fordham to win games for the second straight year and the fifth time since 1981. The day was full of record setting performances: Jim O'Connor's 24th career win, Al Watson's single season batting average, .463, and most hits in a season, 87; and Mike Fernandez's most runs scored-season, 65. The Bears win the first game with Jim O'Connor's third career one-hit shutout (and 18th career complete game), and win the second game with three run homeruns from Scott Hatten and Al Watson and a complete game from Matt Connolly.

**MAY 8-9, 1993**

NYIT 10, Pace 4; NYIT 4, Pace 3 • Pace 12, NYIT 2; NYIT 6, Pace 3 • The Bears win their first Diamond Conference series as Matt McCartin hits a grand slam in the top of the sixth inning, putting the Bears ahead 6-3 in the last game of the series.

**MAY 13, 1993**

NYIT 8, St. John's 2 • Chris McCoy goes the distance in picking up his seventh win and fifth complete game as both Tony Criscuola and Mike Caulfield hit homeruns against the 16th ranked Redmen.

**MARCH 18, 1994**

NYIT 6, Texas Tech 3 • Chris McCoy goes seven innings as the Bears defeat the seventh ranked Red Raiders. Senior Joe Saracino hits a bases loaded triple in the top of the sixth to break a 3-3 dead lock.

**APRIL 17, 1994**

**MARCH 17, 1996**

NYIT 20, UMBC 9 • The Bears score 11 runs in the top of the seventh to erase a 9-4 deficit. They would score five more in the eighth as the Bears collect seven doubles and two homeruns in their 23 hit attack. Eight of the nine starters collected two or more hits.

**MARCH 20-21, 1996**

NYIT 8, Georgia Southern 7 • NYIT 12, The Citadel 9 • The Bears win back-to-back games over the Southern Conference Powers. Against Georgia Southern, the Bears rally from a 7-0 deficit to tie the score in the top of the seventh as they scored five runs highlighted by a two-run double by Brian Montalto. The Bears were able to score the winning run in the top of the 11th on back to back doubles by Ken Iglesias and Cliff Brown. Chris Rojas pitched five innings of one hit relief striking out five in getting the win. NYIT then traveled to Charleston, South Carolina where it scored four runs in the top of the sixth to earn a 10-7 lead over the Citadel. Shane McKeon picks the win by scattering three hits over 1.1 innings of relief.

NYIT 11, Wake Forest 6 • The Bears open the season in a big way as Jim Goelz lines the first pitch of the season over the right field wall as the Bears knockoff No. 28 Wake Forest, who would reach the finals of the NCAA South Regional.

NYIT 4, St. Francis 0 • Steve Brakstad sets a new school record as he strikeouts 16, breaking the old mark of 15 set by John Weglarz. Brakstad struck-out at least one in every inning.

**MARCH 24-25, 1999**

NYIT 20, Wagner 8; NYIT 16, Manhattan 7 • The Bears score 36 runs in two games as they defeat in-state rivals Wagner and Manhattan.

**APRIL 15, 2000**

NYIT 2, Coastal Carolina 1 • Rich Roth throws a complete game, earning the victory while allowing just the one earned run. Rob Santoro scores the second run for the Bears from second base on an infield out in the eighth inning.

**MAY 9, 2001**

NYIT 6, St. John's 3 • Freshmen Wayne Seder, Dan Britton and Tom Park lead NYIT to the victory over St. John's at their campus stadium.

**MAY 12-14, 2001**

NYSBC Playoffs • The Bears score 46 runs in three games to claim the first-ever New York State Baseball Conference Championship.

NYIT 25, Binghamton 9 • Brian Goldberg leads the Bears in the opening round of the playoffs, going 3-for-5 with five RBI, four runs scored and two home runs.

NYIT 10, Stony Brook 1 • Junior Rob Taormina propels the Bears into the title game, pitching a complete game in the finals. Taormina strikes out nine batters, allowing just three hits and no earned runs. Bryan Goelz goes 5-for-5 with two RBI and three runs scored.

NYIT 11, Stony Brook 4 • Ryan Nevins, Bryan Goelz and Tom Merkle all homer and freshmen Wayne Seder, Dan Britton and Tom Park combine to pitch nine innings in the championship game. Nevins finished with two hits, four RBI and a run scored.

**MARCH 9-23, 2002**

The Bears reel off a season-high 10 game winning streak, posting victories over Coppin State, Maryland Eastern Shore, Albany and Yale.

**MARCH 22-23, 2002**

NYIT 6, Yale 1; NYIT 6, Yale 4 • NYIT takes both games of a weekend series at Yale. In the first game Rob Taormina earns the victory, pitching seven innings, allowing just one earned run while striking out seven and Garrett McDevitt provided the offense, homering twice and driving in four runs. In the second game the Bears capitalize on four Yale errors and Dan Britton earns the win, pitching two scoreless innings,

after coming in on relief for Brandon Kurz, who pitched eight innings, allowing just two earned runs on seven hits.

NYIT 13, Hawaii-Hilo 9 • NYIT 16, Northern Colorado 7 • NYIT 11, Pace 2 • The Bears out-score their opponents 40-18 on their way to the first ever Division I Independent Invitational championship. Junior Andrew Karkoulas earns tournament MVP honors going 5-for-10 with four runs scored and three RBI in the first two games and then pitched eight innings, allowing just two earned runs on seven hits with

eight strikeouts in the Bears championship victory over Pace. Senior Tim Smith hits a two-run homerun in the first inning and the Bears homer twice more on their way to the championship. NYIT hits eight homeruns, and eight doubles in the three games.

NYIT 14, NJIT 4 • With his second at bat in the second game of the Great West Conference Tournament, Valdez broke NYIT's single-season hits record of 87 which was set by Al Watson in 1991.

**MAY 28, 2010**

Frank Ryan, who earned All-Tournament honors, tossed 7.2 innings where he scattered six hits and allowed just one run while striking out six. Former Bear Michael MacMillan (B.S. '07) named head baseball coach at NYIT. He is joined on staff by fellow Bears Chris Rojas (B.S. '99) and Lou Bernardi (B.S. '11).

**JULY 9, 2012**

Bob Malvagna becomes the sixth coach in NYIT baseball history.

**DECEMBER 2012**

NYIT breaks ground on a new baseball complex. The new President's Field will feature a FieldTurf surface with natural bases, mound and home plate. The resurfacing also include walk-in dugouts, new batting cages and bullpens, a new 9-inning scoreboard, and a new pressbox relocated to behind home plate.

## Clyde M. Doughty Jr. 31 Years at NYIT

Clyde Doughty, Jr., actually has been at NYIT for 36 years, since the day he first attended a class at the Old Westbury campus (1976). A native of Hollis, Queens, New York, Doughty attended Brooklyn Technical High School, where he played three seasons of varsity basketball.

He earned a scholarship to NYIT and during his basketball career, the Bears made it to the NCAA Tournament twice, losing in the championship game to Virginia Union in 1979–80. After graduating, Doughty became the academic advisor to student-athletes, and three years later, he became the Assistant Director of Athletics. In 1988, he succeeded Dr. William T. Lai as Director of Athletics.

Doughty currently oversees intercollegiate, recreational and intramural athletic programs at the Old Westbury and Manhattan campuses. He counts among his achievements enhancing the athletics department's organizational structure and stability, and improving the academic performances of NYIT's student-athletes. During Doughty's tenure, the Bears have made numerous appearances in NCAA and ECAC post-season play. The men's lacrosse team has won the NCAA National championship four times, 1997, 2003, 2005 and 2008, the ECAC Championship in 2001 and appeared in the NCAA championship game on two other occasions, 1994

and 2002. The men's basketball team captured the ECAC championship in 1995, while the men's track and field placed third at the NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 1999 and second at the indoor championships in 2001.

Doughty, who earned a bachelor's degree in business management, has two master's degrees from NYIT: one in human resource management and one in human relations.

Doughty has served as chair of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference's men's basketball committee, the men's basketball chair of the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference, and was a member of the NCAA's Northeast Men's Basketball Regional Committee for three years. He was president of the NYCAC from 1994 through 1997, and was a member of the ECAC's Executive Council from 1989 until 1992.

In January 2001, Doughty was named to a four-year term as a member of the NCAA Division II Management Council. The council implements policies adopted by the NCAA Executive Committee and the Presidents' Council, interprets Division II bylaws, and recommends the adoption of amendments and regulations regarding Division II athletics.

As part of his Management Council responsibilities, Doughty has served on two project teams and has been a member of the committees on budget and finance, championships, the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and the honors committee.

In 2004, Doughty was selected by the National Athletic Directors Association (NACDA) as the Division II Northeast Region Athletic Director of the Year.

Doughty currently serves on the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Group within the student affairs division. The group supports NCAA staff in the areas of education programs, health and safety and leadership development.

During his tenure, Doughty has assisted in the development and implementation of the Bears Den fundraising club, the establishment of the Athletic Hall of Fame, the annual Bears Golf Outing, the Athletic Directors Honor roll, the BEARS mentor educational program, the Senior Awards banquet, the Bears Care Community Service program, and the Night Out on The Bears community engagement program.

"I am honored that I have been able to sustain a very fruitful career at NYIT," he says. "I have been blessed to work with great individuals who have taken the time to help me mature as an administrator, mentor, parent, and human being."

Doughty resides in Wheatley Heights, NY, with his wife, Pamela, his mother, Ida, and three children: 32-year-old Brandon, 24-year-old Jessica, and 20-year-old Andre.

**DIRECTIONS TO NYIT****BY CAR****FROM THE WEST:**

Long Island Expressway (I-495) to exit 39N (Glen Cove Road). Follow Glen Cove Road north to Northern Blvd. (Route 25 A). Turn right onto Northern Blvd. and head east. The NYIT entrance is the third traffic signal on your right.

**FROM THE EAST:**

LIE (I-495) to exit 41N (Route 107). Go north (toward Glen Cove) on Rte. 107 to Northern Blvd. (Route 25A). Turn left onto Northern Blvd. and continue west for four traffic lights. Make a left into NYIT's main entrance at the fourth traffic light.

**FROM THE SOUTH SHORE:**

Take either the Meadowbrook, Cross Island or Wantagh Parkways north to the Northern State Parkway, exit 31. Make a left at light, proceed north on Glen Cove Road until you reach Northern Blvd. and follow the above directions.

**PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:**

The Long Island Rail Road provides access at several stations: Hicksville, Manhasset and Greenvale (closest to campus). The Metropolitan Transit Authority's Route N20 bus, which travels from Main Street in Flushing to the Hicksville train station via Northern Blvd. stops adjacent to the main entrance of the campus.
