On Sept. 30, 2009, New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) Department of Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation promoted William Dunn to the role of head men's lacrosse coach. Prior to being named head coach, Dunn served as assistant coach, defensive coordinator, and strength and conditioning coach for the team for the past 10 seasons.

Last season, the Bears advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time under the director of Dunn. NYIT compiled a 12-3 overall record and a 6-1 East Coast Conference mark. Sixth-seeded NYIT faced a hard-fought loss to fourth-seeded Adelphi in the first round. Dunn was recognized by his peers as the ECC Coach of the Year, while Danny McDermott was named Defensive Player of the Year and Joe Fallon was named Goalkeeper of the Year. Three Bears - Luke Miller, Ryan Brunet, and McDermott - also received United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) All-America honors.

In 2012, the Bears made a strong run for a bid to the NCAA Tournament but fell short with a 13-3 overall record and an 8-2 East Coast Conference mark that was good for third place. NYIT had a total of eight Bears earn All-ECC honors including ECC Goalkeeper of the Year Billy McGee and ECC Rookie of the Year Luke Miller. Adding to NYIT's long tradition of All-Americans were McGee, Jason Smith and Danny McDermott, who earned first team honors, and Justin Annunziato, who was named honorable mention All-America. The awards did not stop there as Smith was named a CoSIDA Academic At-Large All-District I first team pick.

In 2011, Dunn directed the Bears to a 10-4 record and a 7-3 ECC mark. The season was highlighted by a 10-7 upset of then-No. 3 Dowling. Again, NYIT had an opportunity to return to the NCAA Tournament but with a late season 10-8 edging at then-No. 3 Mercyhurst, the Bears' chance was lost. Six Bears received All-ECC accolades, while four were named USILA All-America - Ryan Amengual, Joe Herman, Chris Lubin, and Brian Mangan.

NYIT produced a solid 8-4 overall record and 6-3 ECC mark in Coach Dunn's first season. Six were named All-ECC, while four were named USILA All-America. Matt Sullivan was the lone first team selection, while Austin Carino, Pete Raab, and Kevin Hennessy were second team honorees.

During Dunn's tenure as assistant coach, the Bears compiled a 114-21 record, advanced to the NCAA Division II tournament five times, and won the national title three - in 2003, 2005, and 2008.

At NYIT, Dunn has coached three United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) National Defensemen of the Year and one USILA Goalie and Player of the Year. Nine of his defensive players have received USILA First Team All-American honors, six have received USILA Second Team All-American honors, and six others have received USILA Honorable Mention All-American honors. In 2008, Dunn was named the Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA) Division II Outstanding Assistant Coach of the Year.

A native of Hicksville, N.Y., Dunn graduated from Hicksville High School and played for SUNY-Cortland from 1977 to 1980. A defenseman, Dunn helped Cortland to three straight SUNYAC championships and three trips to the NCAA Division II tournament, including one appearance in the national championship. Upon graduating, Dunn taught physical education and coached lacrosse and football at MacArthur, Hicksville, Kellenberg Memorial, and Long Beach high schools.

At Kellenberg, where Dunn founded the lacrosse program, he was named the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Coach of the Year and the Man of the Year twice. He led teams to the CHSAA finals three times. Dunn also has coached and played for the North Hempstead Lacrosse Club and served as defensive coordinator for the Empire State Games Team Long Island three times.



KARL HEDSTROM

**Assistant Coach
Sixth Season**

Karl Hedstrom was named an assistant coach for the NYIT lacrosse program in 2009. For his efforts last season, Hedstrom received his first coaching honor as he was recognized by the Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA) as the 2012 Outstanding Assistant Coach of the Year for NCAA Division II.

In his first season (2009), Hedstrom directed NYIT to a No. 9 national ranking in scoring defense. Since then, he has coached several All-Americans, an ECC Goalkeeper of the Year in Billy McGee, and many All-East Coast Conference selections including Pete Raab, who led the nation in 2010 in face-off percentage (.713), and McGee, who led the nation in 2012 in save percentage (.653).

Hedstrom comes to NYIT after serving as the assistant varsity coach at Garden City High School in 2008. As the defensive coordinator, Hedstrom helped Garden City to the Nassau County Class B Championship, coaching two defensive All-Americans, two All-Nassau County Defenders and an All-Nassau County Goalkeeper.

In 2007 Hedstrom was hired as an assistant coach at Nassau Community College. That season, Nassau C.C. finished as the National Junior College Athletic Association national runners-up. Hedstrom also spent the 2005 and 2006 seasons at the United States Merchant Marine Academy as the defensive coordinator and goalie coach. In those two seasons, Hedstrom helped USMMA steer a dramatic turnaround as the team went from a 4-10 record in 2004 to a 12-5 record in 2006.

Prior to heading into the college ranks, Hedstrom got his start at Island Trees High School in 1999 as an assistant coach, where he remained for five seasons. In 2004, he became the defensive coordinator at Seaford High School, where he helped produce two all-county defensive players and an all-county goalkeeper.

Hedstrom attended Hofstra University, where he was a member of the lacrosse team from 1993 through 1997. At Hofstra he was a member of three NCAA Division I lacrosse playoff teams, Hofstra's first NCAA quarterfinalist team and was awarded with the Steve Carlin Award in 1997 (Hofstra lacrosse's Unsung Hero award). Hedstrom graduated in 1997 with a bachelor of arts degree and received his master of arts degree in 1999 from Hofstra.

A resident of Huntington Station, N.Y., Hedstrom has been a tenured fine arts educator at Island Trees High School since 2000. Hedstrom and his wife, Melissa, have a three-year-old daughter, Ava.



STEPHEN TEMPONE

**Assistant Coach
Second Season**

Stephen Tempone returned to his alma mater in January 2013 as an assistant coach for the NYIT men's lacrosse program. Tempone helped lead Bears to their first NCAA Division II National Championship in 1997. He tallied six goals in that national championship game and holds an NCAA record for most goals scored in a Championship game that year.

Tempone comes to NYIT after serving as head coach of the Holy Trinity Titans in Hicksville, N.Y., where he led the Titans to a Catholic State Championship in 2011. He has coached many award-winning catholic lacrosse players during his tenure at Holy Trinity. Tempone started his coaching career at Holy Trinity as a volunteer in 1998. Rejoining the Titans in 2005 as an assistant varsity coach, and, in 2008, he gained college coaching experience at Molloy as an offensive assistant.

Prior to NYIT, Tempone started his college-playing career at Nassau Community College where he was recognized as an All-Region Attack and a Junior College (JUCO) All-Tournament Team pick in 1995. Tempone started playing lacrosse at Holy Trinity, where he was an All-Catholic Team player his junior year.

Tempone is the principle co-founder of North Atlantic Biologix LLC, a medical distributorship that covers the Northeastern area and operates out of Melville, N.Y. The Tempone family currently resides in Bellmore, N.Y.



ANTHONY MUSCARELLA

**Assistant Coach
Fourth Season**

Anthony Muscarella re-joined NYIT's lacrosse program in 2013 after taking a year to begin his high school coaching career. Previously, Muscarella served as an assistant coach from 2010-2012.

Muscarella came to NYIT after a standout lacrosse career at neighboring Hofstra, where he helped the Pride to two Colonial Athletic Association conference championships and was a two-time All-CAA first team honoree.

As a senior, he led Hofstra with 28 goals, was named an *Inside Lacrosse Face-Off Yearbook* 2009 Preseason All-American Honorable Mention and was a Preseason All-Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) selection. The Long Island Lizards of Major League Lacrosse drafted Muscarella with the 29th pick in the fourth round of the 2009 MLL Collegiate Draft.

In 2008 he was awarded with the Bengt Barbaccia Endowed Memorial Scholarship Award, which is a monetary award given to students who either demonstrate high academic achievement or are actively involved in their school or community.

Muscarella graduated from Hofstra with a bachelor of science in business administration and he currently resides in Wantagh N.Y.



BRIAN MANGAN

**Assistant Coach
Third Season**

Brian Mangan was named an assistant coach with the NYIT men's lacrosse team in the Fall 2013. Mangan is responsible for working primarily with the midfielders offensive and defensive training. For the previous two season, Mangan served as a volunteer coach working along side Karl Hedstrom on defense.

Mangan brings 10 years of coaching experience with him as he has coached various club teams on Long Island since 2004. He is also no strangers to NYIT as he graduated in May 2011 with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

Mangan played two season for the Bears in 2010 and 2011 and was named an honorable mention All-American in 2011 by the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA). He also earned All-East Coast Conference honors that season as well.

A native of Wantagh, N.Y., Mangan lettered in lacrosse for three seasons at Wantagh High School. As a senior he received All-America honors and was a two-time all-conference selection.

Battino began his college career at Nassau Community College where he was an all-region and all-tournament team selection. He captained the team that won the 2008 NJCAA National Championship.

Clyde M. Doughty Jr.
32 Years as Athletic Director

Clyde Doughty, Jr., actually has been at NYIT for 37 years, since the day he first attended a class at the Old Westbury campus (1976). A native of Hollis, Queens, New York, Doughty attended Brooklyn Technical High School, where he played three seasons of varsity basketball.

He earned a scholarship to NYIT and during his basketball career, the Bears made it to the NCAA Tournament twice, losing in the championship game to Virginia Union in 1979-80. After graduating, Doughty became the academic advisor to student-athletes, and three years later, he became the Assistant Director of Athletics. In 1988, he succeeded Dr. William T. Lai as Director of Athletics.

Doughty currently oversees intercollegiate, recreational and intramural athletic programs at the Old Westbury and Manhattan campuses. He counts among his achievements enhancing the athletics department's organizational structure and stability, and improving the academic performances of NYIT's student-athletes. During Doughty's tenure, the Bears have made numerous appearances in NCAA and ECAC post-season play. The men's lacrosse team has won the NCAA National championship four times, 1997, 2003, 2005 and 2008, the ECAC Championship in 2001 and appeared in the NCAA championship game on two other occasions, 1994 and 2002. The men's basketball team captured the ECAC championship in 1995, while the men's track and field

placed third at the NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 1999 and second at the indoor championships in 2001.

Doughty, who earned a bachelor's degree in business management, has two master's degrees from NYIT: one in human resource management and one in human relations.

Doughty has served as chair of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference's men's basketball committee, the men's basketball chair of the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference, and was a member of the NCAA's Northeast Men's Basketball Regional Committee for three years. He was president of the NYCAC from 1994 through 1997, and was a member of the ECAC's Executive Council from 1989 until 1992.

In January 2001, Doughty was named to a four-year term as a member of the NCAA Division II Management Council. The council implements policies adopted by the NCAA Executive Committee and the Presidents' Council, interprets Division II bylaws, and recommends the adoption of amendments and regulations regarding Division II athletics. In 2013, he was appointed to a second term as a member of the Division II Management Council.

As part of his Management Council responsibilities, Doughty has served on two project teams and has been a member of the committees on budget and finance, championships, the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), the honors committee, and nominations committee.

In 2004, Doughty was selected by the National Athletic Directors Association (NACDA) as the Division II Northeast Region Athletic Director of the Year.

Doughty currently serves on the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Group within the student affairs division. The group supports NCAA staff in the areas of education programs, health and safety and leadership development. Since 2009, Doughty has also served as the master of ceremonies for the NCAA Career in Sports Forum.

During his tenure, Doughty has assisted in the development and implementation of the Bears Den fundraising club, the establishment of the Athletic Hall of Fame, the annual Bears Golf Outing, the Athletic Directors Honor roll, the BEARS mentor educational program, the Senior Awards banquet, the Bears Care Community Service program, and the Night Out on The Bears community engagement program.

"I am honored that I have been able to sustain a very fruitful career at NYIT," he says. "I have been blessed to work with great individuals who have taken the time to help me mature as an administrator, mentor, parent, and human being."

Doughty resides in Wheatley Heights, NY, with his wife, Pamela, his mother, Ida, and three children: Brandon, Jessica, and Andre.

DIRECTIONS TO NYIT

BY CAR

FROM THE WEST:

Long Island Expressway (I-495) to exit 39N (Glen Cove Road). Follow Glen Cove Road north to Northern Blvd. (Route 25 A). Turn right onto Northern Blvd. and head east. The NYIT entrance is the third traffic signal on your right.

FROM THE EAST:

LIE (I-495) to exit 41N (Route 107). Go north (toward Glen Cove) on Rte. 107 to Northern Blvd. (Route 25A). Turn left onto Northern Blvd. and continue west for four traffic lights. Make a left into NYIT's main entrance at the fourth traffic light.

FROM THE SOUTH SHORE:

Take either the Meadowbrook, Cross Island or Wantagh Parkways north to the Northern State Parkway, exit 31. Make a left at light, proceed north on Glen Cove Road until you reach Northern Blvd. and follow the above directions.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:

The Long Island Rail Road provides access at several stations: Hicksville, Manhasset and Greenvale (closest to campus). The Metropolitan Transit Authority's Route N20 bus, which travels from Main Street in Flushing to the Hicksville train station via Northern Blvd. stops adjacent to the main entrance of the campus.
